The Member Secretary welcomed all the members to the meeting. The members were briefed about the numerous activities undertaken by various schools as well as IQAC. The agenda was taken up as under:-

Agenda -1: To confirm the minutes of the meeting held on July 23, 2021 at 11.00 am in the online mode.

- Minutes were circulated to all by email.
- No comments have been received. Minutes were deemed to be approved.

Agenda-2: To review the Action Taken Report for the points emerging from last meeting.

- Placed and circulated to all members through email along with agenda. (copy enclosed as Annexure -'A'). It was readout for information of all
- The members appreciated the progress on the actions for the discussions held in last meeting.

Agenda-3: To discuss the NIRF 2021 report and its analysis for action

The detailed report on the NIRF performance of the University under various categories as well as participating Schools was placed before the members annexed as "B" to the minutes.

All members appreciated the good performance of the University in various categories vis-à-vis previous years including the improvement in perception.

The University has been ranked 79, Overall it is 99, Law has been ranked 12 for the first time, Management has improved its position to 51st from 57 last year and Engineering has been ranked at 108.

After detailed discussions and suggestions from all including Registrar Sh. S. S. Parihar, the following decisions were taken:

- University should publicise the good ranking adequately at all forums. The Schools and the Administration need to take steps for the same.
- The University should identify the potential areas of improvement and take necessary steps to enhance its performance.
- Teaching Learning & Resources need improvement as it has reduced in the last year across University Schools
- Graduation Outcomes need improvement
- Outreach and Inclusivity needs focus after the covid-19 as it has marginally been impacted.

All the above areas need attention of all schools and proposals to improve the same after due deliberations may be initiated.

In addition, perception building needs attention. The faculty and schools may initiate steps to involve professionals and academicians from other states for enhancing the branding of the institutions.

Agenda-4: To review the progress for 3rd Cycle of NAAC's Assessment and Accreditation of the University and Plan of Action.

A full time dedicated team comprising of Prof. A.K.Saini, Prof. Neena Sinha, Prof. Sanjay Dhingra, Prof. Manoj Taleja and Dr Ashish Manchanda are working on NAAC work. They are assisted by the 2 member team for each of the seven criteria of the NAAC Self Study Report. However, the University is committed to initiate the process of submission just after the AQAR for the year 2019-20 is approved by NAAC. Thereafter the IIQA would be submitted for approval to NAAC, which is a pre-requisite for SSR filing and submission.

The Director Development requested the Deans of various USS/Section Heads/School Coordinators to provide the remaining data as per the desired format.

The work is under process and the first draft will be ready around 2nd week of January 2022 for the completion of the first draft.

It is planned to file the NAAC SSR Report and DVV for the 3rd cycle of NAAC Accreditation of the University in next 2 months time.

All members assured full support for the completion of the same.

Agenda-5: To discuss the conduct of quality oriented activities in various USS in the coming session.

It was informed that all the Schools and the Sections/Branches have been advised to conduct activities for quality improvements with the consultation of the IIQAC. Some of the



activities planned by IIQAC Cell in next three months are: Digital sensitisation and challenges such as Cyber Security, Systematic Literature Review and Bibliometric Analysis, Skill Development in the Covid times, Gender Sensitization and Empowerment, Staff Development Programmes on important topics, Conference on Accessibility and Inclusiveness, etc.

All the NAAC Coordinators were requested to undertake the same. The list was approved by all the members.

Agenda-6: To discuss the admission process and its review to enhance admissions in various programmes.

The members were apprised of the admission status in various programs of the University. It was informed that admission schedule had to be extended. The delayed admission process beyond the control of the University has resulted in vacancy in many programmes as by this time majority of the students have already got admitted in other institutions.

It was recommended that timely admission is very important for the University because University has 85% admission reserved for Delhi Students.

It was recommended that for 2022-23, University must announce the admission process as soon as possible by February 2022. The admission to the management programmes which is based on CAT score should be delinked with the main admission process and announced by January 2022 and finish it by May 2022. It was felt that most of the students take admissions based on CAT in the month of January onwards and their classes start by June.

For other programmes, the University should advance the admission process to February.

All members accepted the proposal. Registrar Sh Parihar assured that University will surely make serious efforts to implement the same.

Agenda-7: To discuss about the conduct of value added courses by Schools

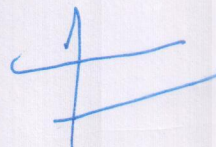
It was informed that scheme of various programmes of study specifies the various courses. It was felt that Schools based on the needs of the students have been organising number of programmes to supplement the employability skills, Life skills and other technical skillsets among students for the last few years. These programmes have been quite useful for the students. These can be optionally offered to all students and cannot be made mandatory.

It was suggested that these programmes should be enhanced and may cover all areas beyond the curriculum and should carry weightage of 2 credits and can be offered in online mode. In addition, the students can also choose any open elective from other inter-disciplinary areas as well. All such courses should be given a code and its proper record with feedback should be available to assess its usefulness.

These courses can be delivered with the help of some collaboration with industries/training organisations and students completing the course may be issued Certificates.

All the NAAC Coordinators were requested to undertake the same in their Schools.

The proposal was approved by the members.



Agenda-8: To discuss the progress on adoption of NEP 2020

It was informed that the multi-entry and multi-exit policy as per NEP has been implemented in the University. The University is waiting the formation of Academic Bank of Credits, the guidelines for 4 year graduation and 1 year post graduation. After these are available, the necessary launch of such programmes shall be undertaken. It was also informed that as per NEP 2020 recommendations, University shall discontinue the M.Phil (English) from the next academic session wef 2022-23. The colleges are being motivated to apply for accreditation. The work on other aspects of NEP is under process by the University.

It was suggested that few more Workshops on NEP may be organised to gain deeper insights in the area. In addition, Director-Academic Affairs may be requested to put all the required processes and systems in place with appropriate approvals.

Agenda-9: Any other agenda with the permission of the Chair.

a) The Action Taken report on the Feedback collected from stakeholders i.e. Students, Alumni, Parents, Teachers and Employers

It was informed that University has an online system of collecting the feedback from the stakeholders i.e. Students, Alumni, Parents, Teachers and Employers. This is intended for curriculum design and redesign. Further it was placed on records that University has been collecting the feedback from the Students every semester since inception.

The IIQAC Cell share the feedback collected with each school of study program wise to understand the needs of the stakeholders. The Schools undertake the same in their various academic bodies and bring about the necessary changes which could be minor or major or may involve conduct of additional value based courses or trainings.

The Action Taken Report on the feedback as received from the Schools was placed for the members. The detailed report was highly appreciated by all especially the external members. The feedback has been put on the University website.

b) Signing of MOUs

The members were apprised of the several MOUs that have been signed by University to build connect with the industry as well as collaborative activities in various domains of knowledge.

The meeting ended with a vote of thanks to the Chair.

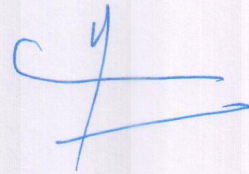
